Why is a VA Disability Rating Important?

- Makes the condition a matter of record
- Gives you <u>priority</u> in VA health care system
- Establishes the <u>service connection</u> if condition worsens
- Provides tax free VA compensation
- Can provide <u>additional benefits and payments</u>:
 - Combat Related Special Compensation or
 - Concurrent Retirement and Disability Pay for over 50% disability
- Supports service-connected <u>death claim</u>

Vietnam Presumptive Agent Orange Condition

 Veterans who served anywhere in Vietnam between January 9, 1962 and May 7, 1975 are presumed to have been exposed to herbicides

- Presumptive service connected conditions:
 - Acute and Subacute Peripheral Neuropathy
 - AL Amyloidosis
 - Chloracne (or Similar Acneform Disease)
 - Chronic B-cell Leukemias
 - Diabetes Mellitus (Type 2)
 - Hodgkin's Disease
 - Ischemic Heart Disease
 - Multiple Myeloma
 - Soft Tissue Sarcoma (other than Osteosarcoma, Chondrosarcoma, Kaposi's sarcoma, or Mesothelioma)

- Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma
- Parkinson's Disease
- Porphyria Cutanea Tarda
- Prostate Cancer
- Respiratory Cancers

Presumptive Agent Orange Claim Submission

- Were you in country of Vietnam
- Documentation to prove it

You are Presumed exposed to Agent Orange

Clear Diagnosis of an Agent Orange Condition

- Have Doctor complete a DBQ
- Showing a clear diagnosis and manifestation

- Complete the 21-526EZ
- Send to VA Regional Office

Initiate the VA Claim

VA Claim Submission Process – A Step by Step Guide

□ First, complete a fully developed VBA-21-526EZ

- Include with the VBA-21-526EZ
 - DBQ completed by your treating doctor for your agent orange condition

- DD-214 showing time in country of Vietnam

Presumptive Agent Orange Process

- Submit the Claim
- Wait 30-90days for notification from VA

VCAA Notice

Medical Exam

- VA will schedule for you the date, time, location
- · Don't miss it!

- Waiting.....
- Possibly Weeks or Months

Decision

VA Claim Process – Next Steps

- Wait... and then in 30-90 days the VA will send you acknowledgement of the claim
- They may also send a VCAA notice or 5103
 Waiver which may ask for a duplication of paperwork already sent

Do not resend paperwork

- Next, you may be called to a medical exam by a contracted doctor – QTC
- It takes on average 1 year for claims to be adjudicated

How does the VA make their decision?

- The VA is bound by the Code of Federal Regulation
- The Disability Benefits Questionnaire your doctor completes puts medical information into a format that the VA can understand per the regulations
- Once the VA determines time in country of Vietnam and the clear diagnosis of the presumptive agent orange condition, then the VA looks at how severe the condition is per the Code of Federal Regulation

Example of CFR

7005 Arteriosclerotic heart disease (Coronary artery disease): Ischemic Heart Disease

With documented coronary artery disease resulting in: Chronic congestive heart failure, or; workload of 3 METs or less results in dyspnea, fatigue, angina, dizziness, or syncope, or; left ventricular dysfunction with an ejection fraction of less than 30

Percent 100

More than one episode of acute congestive heart failure in the past year, or; workload of greater than 3 METs but not greater than 5 METs results in dyspnea, fatigue, angina, dizziness, or syncope, or; left ventricular dysfunction with an ejection fraction of 30 to 50

Percent 60

Workload of greater than 5 METs but not greater than 7 METs results in dyspnea, fatigue, angina, dizziness, or syncope, or; evidence of cardiac hypertrophy or dilatation on electrocardiogram, echocardiogram, or X-ray

Percent 30

Workload of greater than 7 METs but not greater than 10 METs results in dyspnea, fatigue, angina, dizziness, or syncope, or; continuous medication required

Percent 10

The Decision

- Finally, you will receive a VA Award Letter and Rating Decision
 - Notice the Rating Decision will clearly outline the CFR, why the VA decided the claim as they did, and what medical information is needed to achieve a higher percentage
- Important items: Making it a matter of record
 - 0% This is NOT a denial of benefits; it simply means the VA acknowledges the condition as service connected, but it does not warrant compensation per the CFR
 - 10% or higher You can go to any VA medical center and at no cost obtain eye glasses and hearing aids

VA Compensation

Death Benefits

- VA benefits at death
- Prepare your survivors Important Documents

VA Benefits at Death

- None if the death certificate does not list a condition that is service connected
- If death is due to a service-connected condition:
 - Any Condition for which a veteran is service connected or is considered presumptive should be clearly listed on the death certificate for the VA to grant benefits
 - For example, if service connected for presumptive agent orange *lung cancer*, then *lung cancer* must be listed on the death certificate
 - Partial refund of SBP payments (if SBP selected)
 - Portion of SBP paid tax free by the VA (\$1,215)
 - If no retired pay, \$1,215 is paid tax free to spouse
 - VA Burial Benefit of up to \$2,000
- Surviving spouse must apply for these death benefits

Important Documents

- DD-214 / Statement of Service
- Marriage / Divorce Documents
- VA Award Letters
- Insurance Policies
- Social Security Card
- Wills / Powers of Attorney
- Trust Documents



What if your condition is not on Presumptive Agent Orange List?

- If you have a condition that is not on the presumptive agent orange list but feel it is attributed to agent orange, submit a claim anyway
 - Makes it a matter of record
 - If the Agent Orange List is amended to include the condition, then you will receive retro payment
